The Australian Dispute Resolution Association (ADRA) is an association for ADR practitioners and others who have an interest in ADR. An incorporated Association, it was established in 1987 to promote and enhance the practice and development of Dispute Resolution in Australia. Based in NSW, it is run by a Board of management elected by the members at each Annual General Meeting.

ADRA's main aims are to:

- promote the practice of ADR;

- make representations in the interests of ADR; and

What We Do
