As you may recall we wrote to you last year announcing ADRA's 10th Anniversary Student Essay Competition. The three winners were all students from Bond University and the winner attended the dinner following our Annual General Meeting in October 1997 to receive her prize. The winning entry was published in the *Australian Dispute Resolution Journal*.

The ADRA Board has decided to again run the student essay competition. The competition, for students who are enrolled in a tertiary course in dispute resolution/mediation in 1998, is designed to encourage student research and writing on dispute resolution, and to recognise and reward excellence. Terms and Conditions

1. The judges will be three members of the Board of Management of ADRA Inc and the decision of the judges will be final.
2. Participation in the competition is open to tertiary undergraduate students only, and entrants should provide course details and the name of a referee from their tertiary institution.
3. To enter the competition submit an essay on a topic relating to Dispute Resolution which you have submitted for assessment in any 1999 course. One essay per entrant to be submitted only. Essays may vary in length between 2,000 and 4,500 words.
4. The winning essays may be published in Mediation News or the Australasian Dispute Resolution Journal, subject to the consent of the respective editor and at the discretion of the judges.
5. The judges reserve the right to not allocate prize money if in their opinion entries are not of a sufficiently high or meritorious standard. In the event of exercising this discretion the judges' decision will also be final and no correspondence will be entered into.
6. Entries must be received by Thursday, 7 October, 1999 and the judges' decision will be announced on or before 29 October, 1999.
