

You are invited to participate in the Asian/Pacific Conflict Resolution Training Program.

Conflict Resolution skills training provides:

- . a better way of dealing with differences, disputes, conflicts and violence;
- . improved communication, efficiency, effectiveness and productivity;
- . a more fulfilling public, work and home environment;
- . participative decision-making;
- . unleashing of new potential and opportunity.

These skills are a vital and essential component for problem-solving, grievance handling and alternative dispute resolution in the professions of government, public service, policing and corrective service, management, law, social work, education and science, and development programs.

Course Co-ordinators: The Training Program will be co-ordinated by:-

Helena Cornelius, psychologist and Director of The Conflict Resolution Network; and,

Dr Greg Tillett, lecturer in Conflict Resolution at Macquarie University.

Trainers and leaders are qualified and experienced professionals, drawn from disciplines including education, psychology, social work, financial and sales management, economics, accounting and business administration.

CERTIFICATES OF COMPLETION WILL BE ISSUED.

Content includes:-

- . Negotiation.
- . Analysing and mapping the conflict
- . Responding to aggression and violence.
- . Mediation.
- . The creative response to conflict.
- . Conflict resolving in meetings.
- . Appropriate assertiveness.
- . Managing emotions in conflict.
- . Encouraging the willingness to resolve.

Method of Teaching: The course will use a wide range of participative teaching techniques, and most examples used in these processes will be drawn from the real experiences of participants. Numbers of students will be kept small to maximise learning opportunities. Training will be conducted in English.

Goals: By the end of the course, participants will:-

- . be familiar with a range of conflict resolution skills;
- . be able to apply these skills in specific contexts relevant to their own work;
- . be able to integrate a conflict resolution structure in their own organisations.

Costs: \$600 program fees (which does not include fares, accommodation and meals).

Participants requiring low cost accommodation should contact the organisers.

Scholarships: We welcome application for the limited number of scholarships available. These may include assistance with travel and accommodation, meals and fares, but will generally cover remission of tuition fees.
