Youth Justice Conferencing in NSW: The First Year of the Act

Jenny is the Director of the the Youth Justice Conferencing Program. Prior to taking up this appointment, Jenny was an academic at the University of NSW Law School. In this position Jenny contributed to the research and the writing of the influential reports, *Kids in Justice: a blueprint for the 90's* and *Nobody Listens: The experiences of contact between young people and police*.

Jenny spoke to ADRA members in July 1998 about the introduction of the Young Offenders Act and the implementation of youth justice conferences. Jenny's talk was extremely well received and generated much interest.
