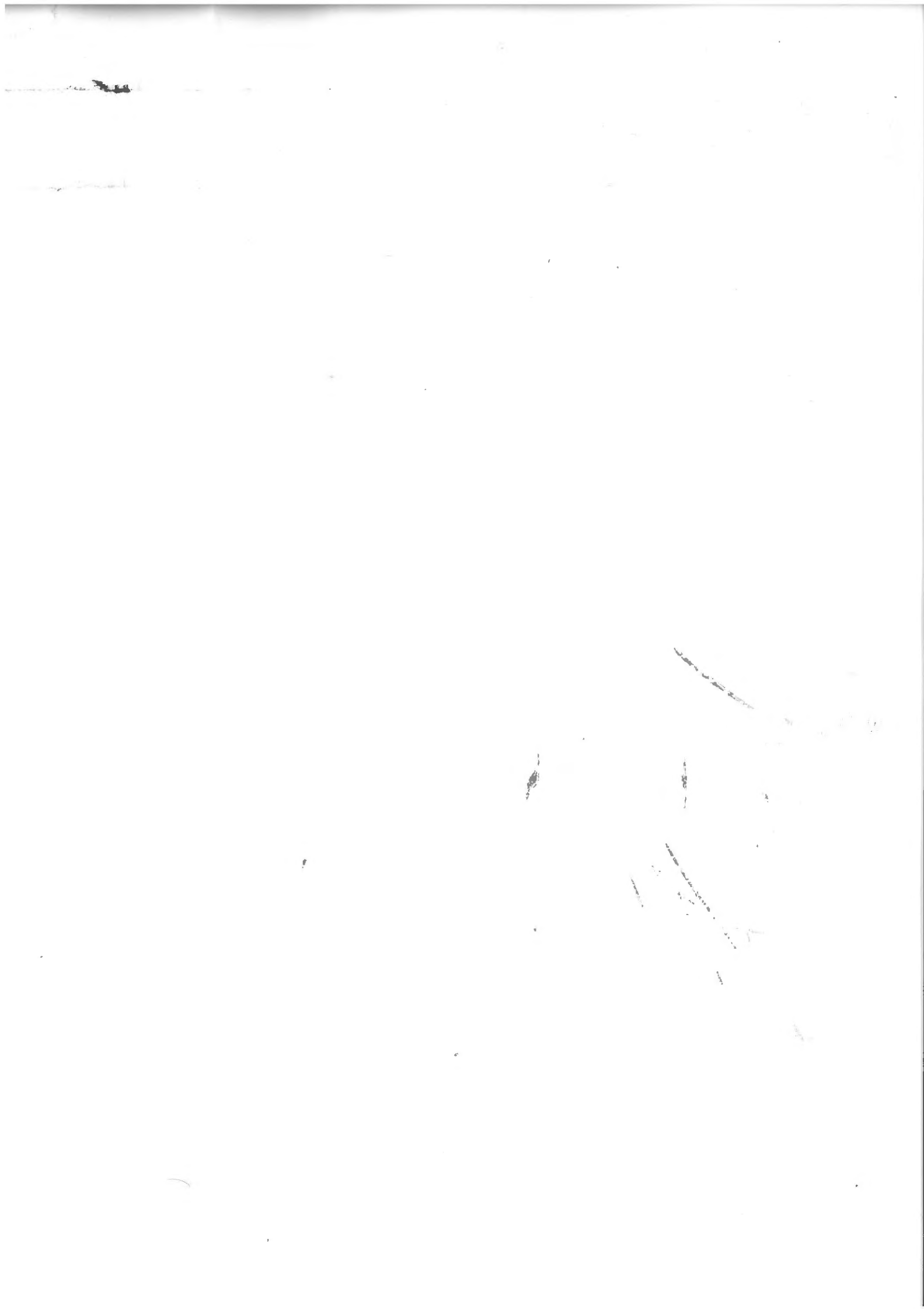

Objectives

The objectives of the Association include:

3. Developing, maintaining and promoting alternative dispute resolution standards.
4. Providing and supporting education and research in the theory and practice of alternative dispute resolution.
5. The printing, publishing and circulation of all manner of information pertaining to ADR and to the education and facilitation of ADR.
6. Enhancing the professional skills of mediators, conciliators and other practitioners in alternative dispute resolution and of administrators of alternative dispute resolution services.
7. Co-operation and affiliation with other organisations in order to achieve these objectives.
8. Making representations in the interest of all members of the Association in all matters affecting or concerning the Association and the resolution of disputes by ADR.

Management of ADRA Inc

A Board of Management is elected at every Annual General Meeting of members.

Sub-committees arrange publication of a quarterly newsletter, functions and seminars on ADR to enhance the skills of members and promote the exchange of ideas.

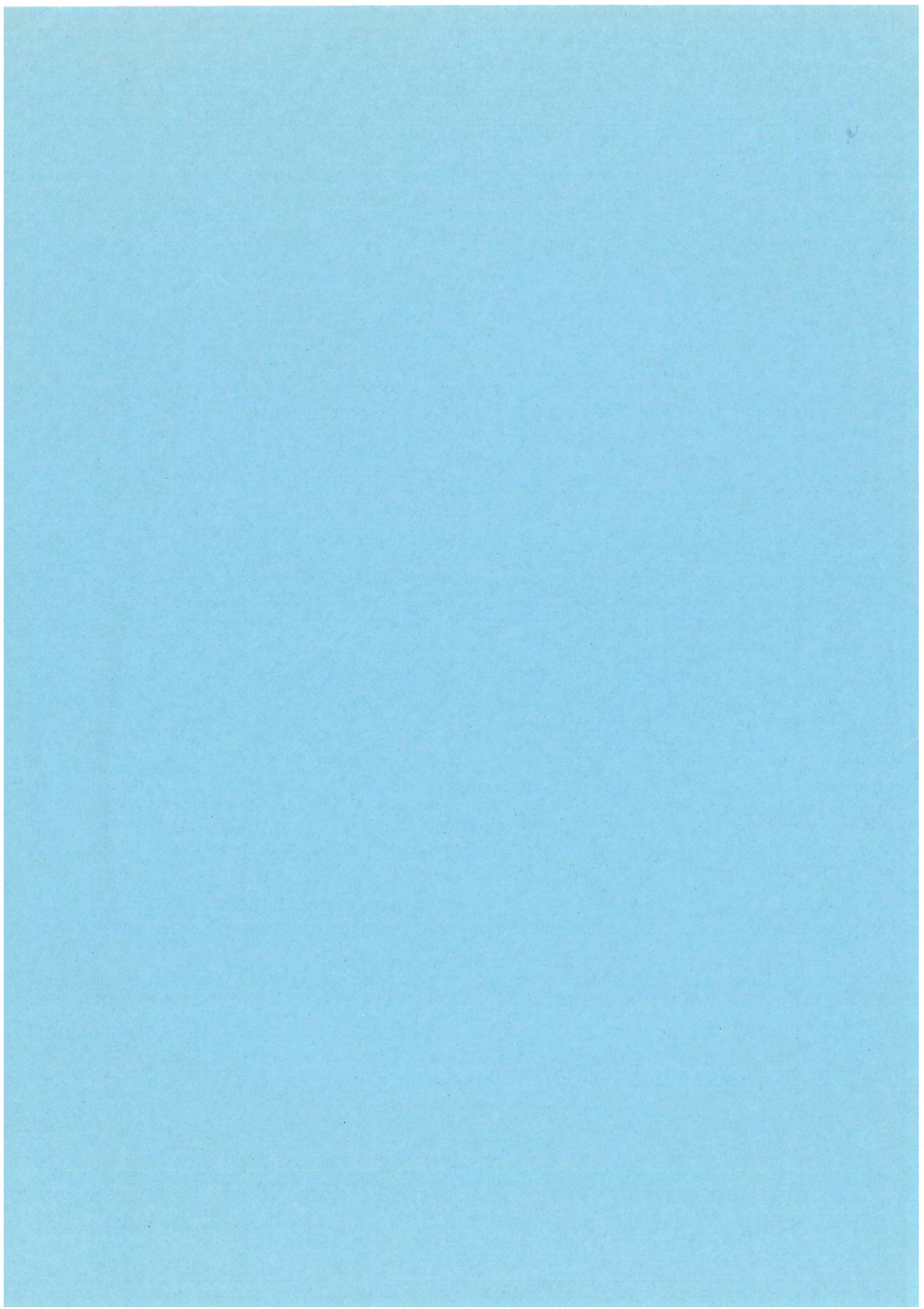
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
